# 1

- We use **an** before words which begin with a vowel (a, e, i, o, u).

*an atlas          an eraser          an orange*

- We use **a** before words that begin with a consonant (b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, y, z).

*a notebook          a pen          a ruler*
