Elvis Aaron Presley was born on January 8, 1935, in Mississippi, USA. He won a singing contest at the age of six and played his first guitar at the age of eleven. As a young man, Elvis worked as a truck driver before he became a singer.

He had his first hit, 'Heartbreak Hotel', in 1956. In the same year, he made his first movie, 'Love me Tender'. In 1958, Elvis joined the army and went to Germany. There he met Priscilla Beaulieu. They married in 1967. Elvis became one of the richest singers in history. During his lifetime he recorded a large number of songs and many of them were big hits. He performed his last concert on June 26, 1977.

Sadly, Elvis died shortly after on August 16. He was only 42 years old. 'The King' is dead, but his legend lives on!


Frances Ethel Gumm – or Judy Garland as she is known – was born on June 10, 1922 in Minnesota, USA.

She had two sisters and from an early age they appeared together in short movies and sang on local radio shows. Judy recorded her first song in 1936.

Judy joined MGM studios when she was 13. Between 1939 and 1950 she made twenty-two films, including the ever-famous *The Wizard of Oz.*

Judy grew up to be a legend in her own lifetime, and to this day has thousands of fans all over the world.

Sadly, Judy died before her time – she was just 47 – on June 22, 1969.



Roddy McDowall was born in London on September 17, 1928.

He made his first film, Yellow Sands when he was only 10.

His family moved to Hollywood in 1940 and Roddy soon became a well-known child actor. His most famous film as a child is *Lassie Come Home* (1943).

In later years, as an adult, Roddy starred in many more films, including Cleopatra and Planet of the Apes, and also starred as the Bookworm in the Batman series.


