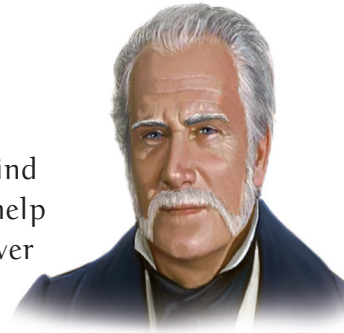
The Plot

Jack is a young thief who finds Oliver on the streets of London and introduces him to a world of crime.



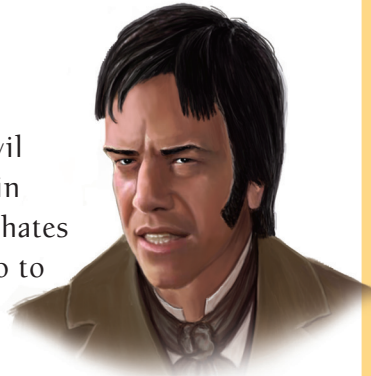


Fagin

Monks, Oliver's half-brother, is an evil man who is involved with Fagin and his gang of thieves. He hates Oliver and wants him to go to prison.

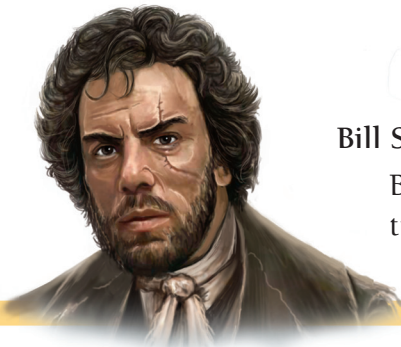
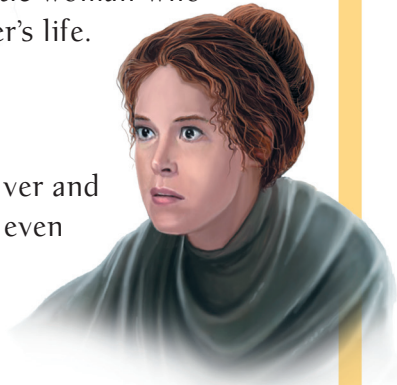


Rose Maylie
