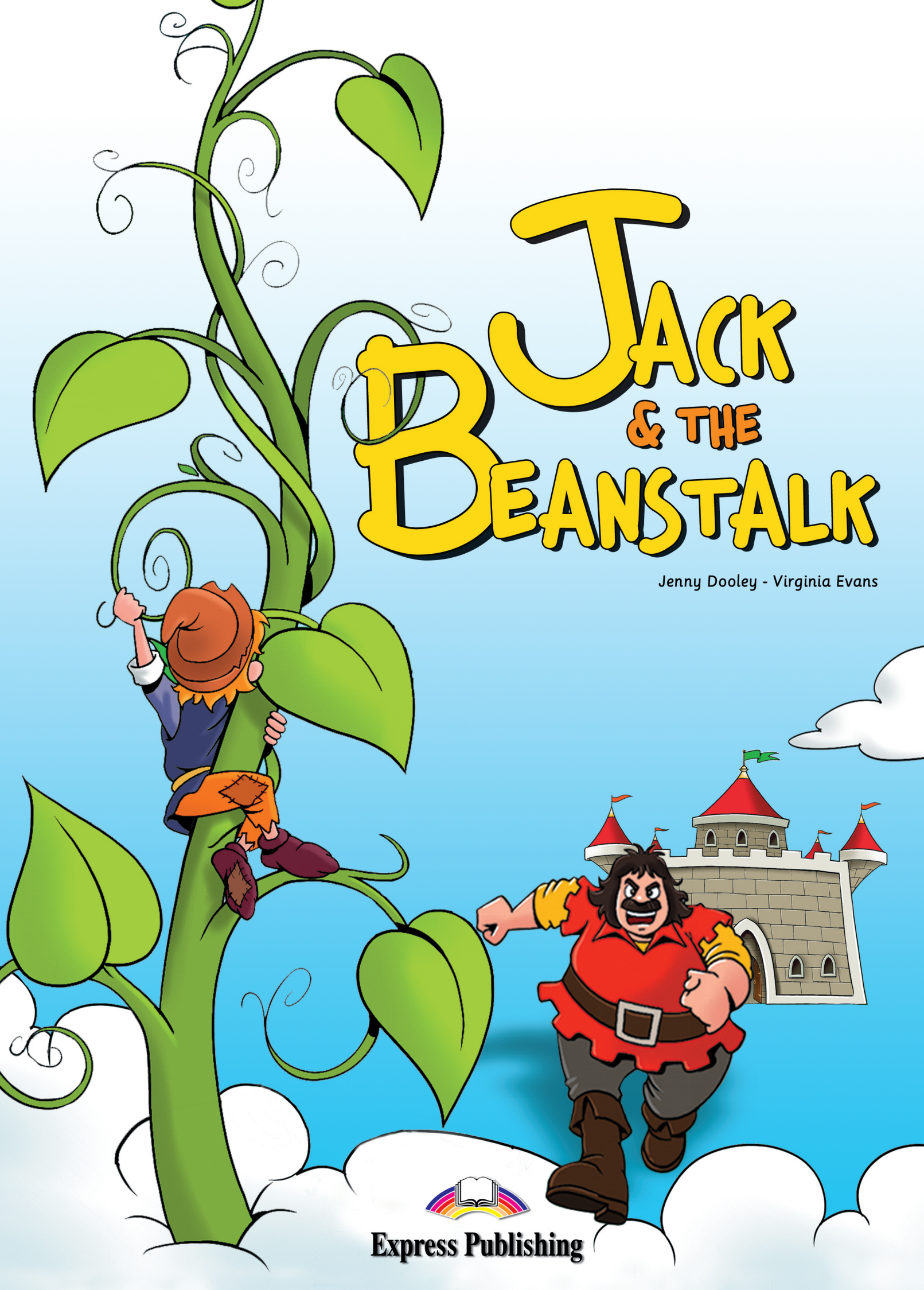


JACK & THE BEANSTALK
